<p>Clarinet: -four, 2.5-strength Reeds -hankie-style swab -cork grease -David Hite Premiere Mouthpiece</p>	<p>Trombone: -6.5AL mouthpiece -slide grease -slide oil (Al Cass Fast, recommended) -small spray bottle -small washcloth</p>
<p>Saxophone: -four, 2.5-strength Reeds -2 hankie-style swabs (two sizes, one for neck, one for body) -cork grease -Yamaha mouthpiece (4C/5C)</p>	<p>Percussion: -Bell kit <u>This includes</u> -Bells and stand -1 pair of mallets, 1 pair of wood snare sticks (non nylon tipped) -practice pad</p>
